Let Afghan Girls Learn And Earn







From Sevara and Nargis, leaders of the Let Afghan Girls Learn And Earn:

Starting the project as two individuals one of which was hybrid, we were both excited and nervous at the same time. Yet we managed to plan first then act accordingly as best as we can.

Although we mark the delivery of the project as smooth, there were still challenges that we have faced that taught us lessons.

Starting with the selection of students and teachers, to minimise risk, we tried to use personal connection however it was not easy to ask for such help while minimising the risk. That is why we took the time to slowly but effectively opt teachers so that we are not contradicting any laws or disturbing safety.

The next challenge was providing the materials for the teachers because we wanted a thorough and effective syllabus for a short period of time and hence we spent many hours consulting and gathering notes from one of the Mathematics teachers in Kabul. Which could have been minimised by preparing the material prior to the summer of 2023 but we managed to do it in a short period of time. The other challenge was not enough planning in case of unpredictable situations, for instance one of the teachers, after the selection process, faced an issue inhibiting her from teaching in which case we had to contact another teacher immediately to replace the position. This could also be done effectively if we had a waiting list for individuals for potential positions but just because our connection was secure, it didn't create a huge impact.

Of the challenges throughout this project, safety was a main concern and practise for us, teachers and the students, therefore we made sure to not exchange excessive information about ourselves except for the necessary and follow up with the teacher and students on a weekly basis in case of any concerns which sometimes was difficult.

After all, we learned that taking unpredictable situations into consideration saves much time and effort and makes the experience less chaotic.

However, despite the difficulties we have faced, what made the project special was the way it helped us enhance our personal growth, create job opportunities for our teachers and boost the knowledge of our students. The feedback we received from our team was brilliant as they found the project inspiring just like a glimmer of light amidst darkness. We all knew the project as a sense of hope and as a source of energy to keep assisting the affected girls in Afghanistan.

We managed to include more than 25 students in the project with different backgrounds specialising their economic background and their passion and some of our teachers took the initiative to teach beyond their capacity to more students and use different techniques to better educate their students. The project assisted many teachers not only to find a job and provide income for their families but also it was also an escape from long, sickening days of joblessness minimising the risk of being afflicted with mental health issues as you may find in their statements below.

At the end of the project, we met our target of running a pilot project for girls education considering safety, minimising risk, and empowering female students and educators. We provided a basic knowledge of two subjects for our students as a base to extend the project, part of our aim which we are still working towards.

"Throughout this experience, I learned the importance of teamwork and making weighted decisions to ensure teachers' safety. Working collaboratively, we combined our knowledge and perspectives to make informed choices. I also improved my communication skills,

realizing its vital role in fostering understanding and problem-solving within a team.

Moreover, I recognized the significance of taking action when witnessing concerning situations, rather than ignoring them. I embraced the value of making education accessible to everyone, advocating for equal opportunities and removing barriers. This experience has contributed to my personal growth, equipping me with valuable skills that I will continue to apply in creating safer, more inclusive educational environments." Sevara
